THE ALPHA AND OMEGA

Rev. Brandon T. Whitehurst, Sr. Revelation 22:13 I am the Alpha and the Omega, the First and the Last, the Beginning and the End.

In our passage, John is not giving us mere titles of who God is or what God does. Instead, we are given an assurance of who God will always be. It is also important to note that these titles stretch beyond designations of one being greater than the other. So often we try to measure potential, ability, and even the level of success based upon designation. The hard truth is, in the spaces where those things would normally matter, they don't matter at all when it comes to the Kingdom of God.

During this Lenten season, as things have changed all around us, many have encountered spiritual, mental, and physical changes, not to mention those that affect us all. Regardless of where we have seen those changes take place or have experienced them personally, the constant has been God.

The endurance of many is more than often situational, however, when it comes to God that's not the result. God doesn't show up sporadically or half-heartedly but is there from

beginning to end. More specifically Isaiah 44:6 weighs in on this truth that there is none that can compare - "I am the first and I am the last; apart from me there is no God."

Simply put our all in all! The question we should ask ourselves is have we allowed God to be the source of all things in our lives?
